

York Water District celebrates Donald Neumann's 40 years of service

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YORK -- Water district employees, trustees, colleagues and family came together at the 86 Woodbridge Road office to celebrate Superintendent Donald Neumann's 40th consecutive year of service to the town on Tuesday, Oct. 22.

Neumann is the fourth superintendent in the history of York Water District, and the first to reach 40 years of service. Beginning as a laborer at 18 years old, he worked his way through the ranks of the district reaching his current position in 2005. He has spent his career working and fighting to make the district the best it can be, and an enjoyable and rewarding place to work, according to a press release.

Neumann has played a major part in creating the reliable, high-quality water treatment and distribution system that serves residents of York. He has pushed for aggressive water main replacement and flushing programs while simultaneously keeping costs down for ratepayers. The release said Neumann has a proactive and considerate attitude that carries through all of the water district's operations. For this reason, York Water District continues to be a model for water utilities across the region.

In a statement released this week, York Water District employees thanked Neumann for everything he has done for them and the district over the past 40 years and wished him success in the remainder of his career.
